

- -Three inter-related sub program areas-
- 1. Standardized Multi-community Traditional Cultural Study (2002)
- 2. Industry Community Referral Process (2006)
- 3. Technical Support (2002)



#### What We've Accomplished:

- Multi-community Traditional Cultural Study -
- 1)Documented and storing +2300 (~1400 in 2007) quality control reviewed sites from 4 communities
- 2) Training with over 25 community technicians
- 3)Interviews with 52 community elders
- 4) Youth participants 64



#### What We've Accomplished:

- Referral Process –
- 1) 1 pilot from Gov't (Alberta TPRC)
- 2) 9 pilot referral runs by 4 companies (Shell, Suncor, West Fraser, Coal Valley Resources)
- 3) Protection of 91 cultural sites from potential disturbances
- 4) Savings to companies of \$10-30k per day of planning time by using process



#### What We've Accomplished:

- 1) Highest density of traditional data documented in the nation
- Regional coordination table for access and communication with communities for land use
- 3) Phase 1 of Foothills Aboriginal Engagement Pilot underway
- 4) No major political blow ups

Relying on data and technology rather than strictly politics and policy

#### 3) Respect:

Utilize the data we have via relationships



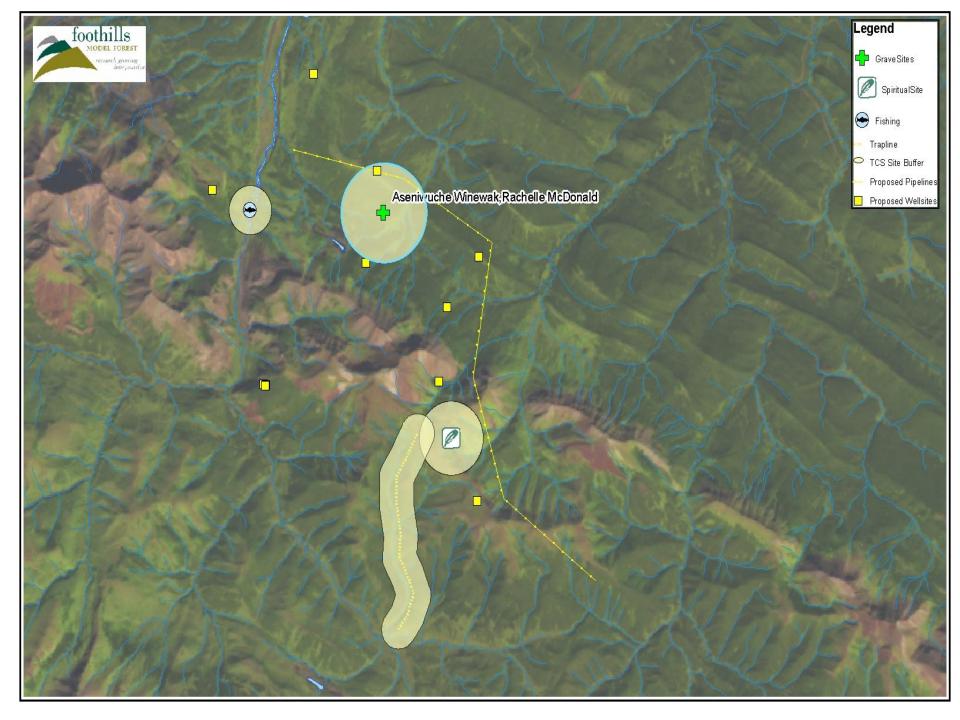
- 1) Proposed development; potential impact; assessment

- 4) Processes and Relationships to Utilize Data and Dispense Consultation Efforts




#### World Class Traditional Use Study





- 4) Phase 2: Pilot Process Operations Winter 2008










# Pilot Issues

# The Opportunity

- Co-operation (assessments, notifications, access to process)
- •Reduces liabilities (data and 'agreed' process driven rather than judgement calls)
- Decreases uncertainty (contracts, roles, process understood)



# The Opportunity

- Deals with over-lapping issues confidentially
- Efficiencies (timing, responses)
- Excellence in research, process management, administration
