## **Model forest** wins nationa award

Foothills Model Forest (FMF) has garnered an award for working well with others.

Late last month, FMF general manager Don Podlubny was in Montreal to accept first ever Syncrude Award for Excellence in Sustainability Development.

"It is heartening to be the first organization to receive this prestigious national award, in a field that encompasses such a broad spectrum of possible candidates," said Jim LeLacheur, president of FMF.

original 10 model forests that were estab-

lished in 1992.

It remains the second largest of all of Canada's model forests and covers rough-

ly 2.75 million hectares.

Its landbase extends to Jasper National Park, Willmore Wilderness Park and also includes the Hinton Wood Products' forest management area.

It also includes some Crown land and the Hinton Training Centre's Cache

Percotte training forest.

Podlubny said that FMF was nominated for the award by one of its many partners
