Change in full-time school attendance for those 15-24, 1991-1996

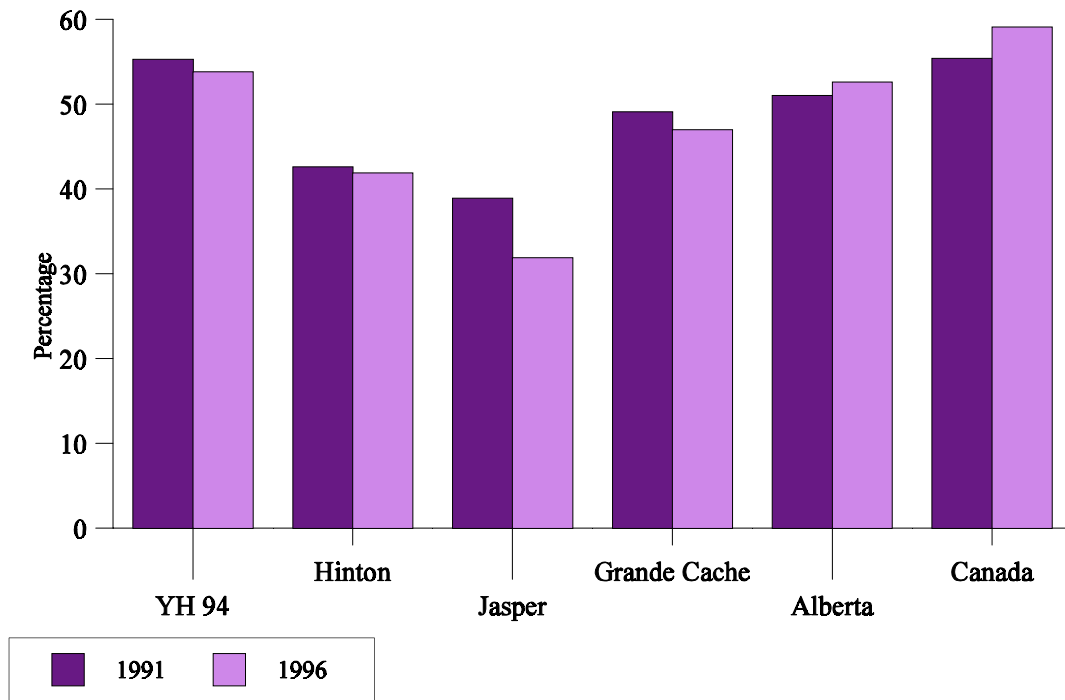

Change in education attainment, YH 94 1986-1996.

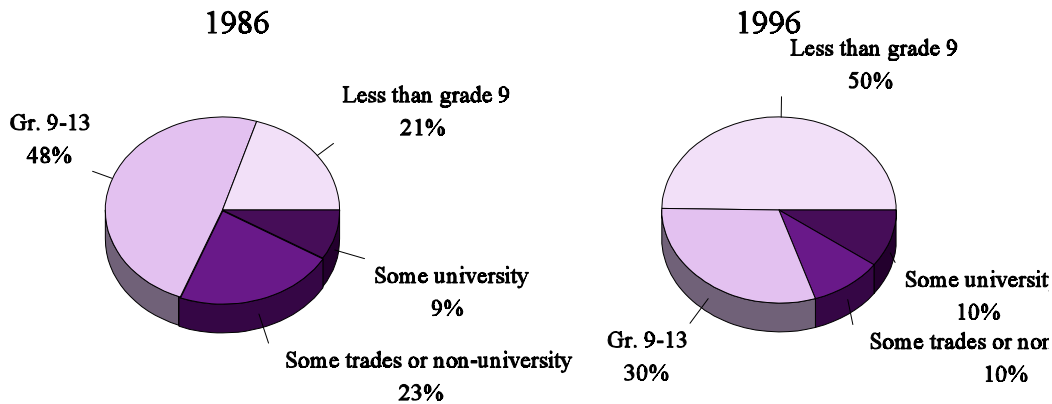

Change in education attainment, Hinton 1986-1996.

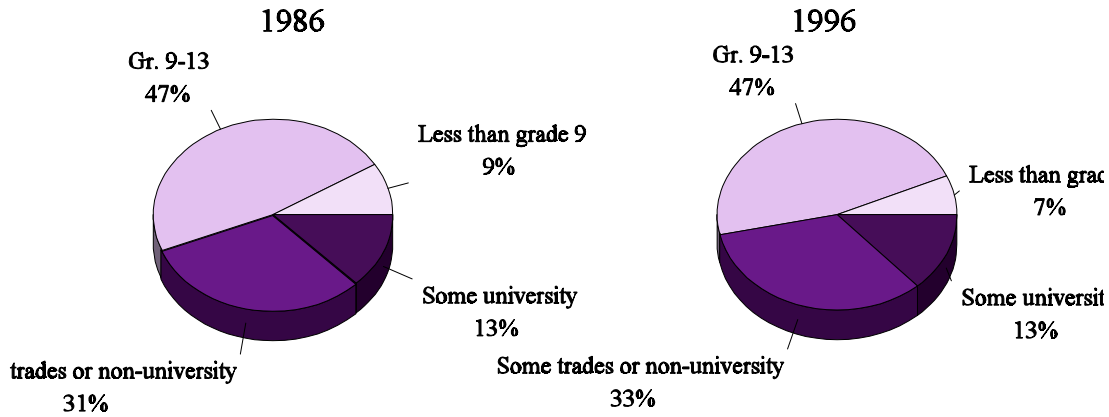

Change in education attainment, Jasper 1986-1996.

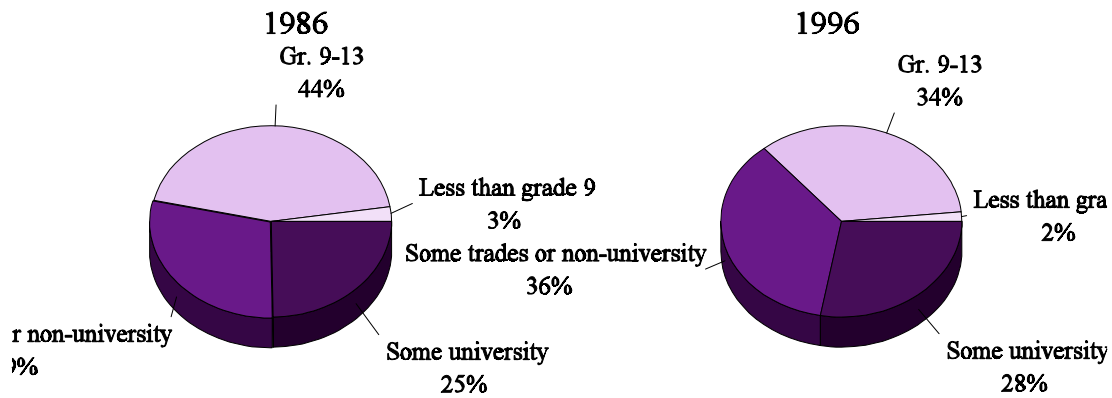

Change in education attainment, Grande Cache 1986-1996.

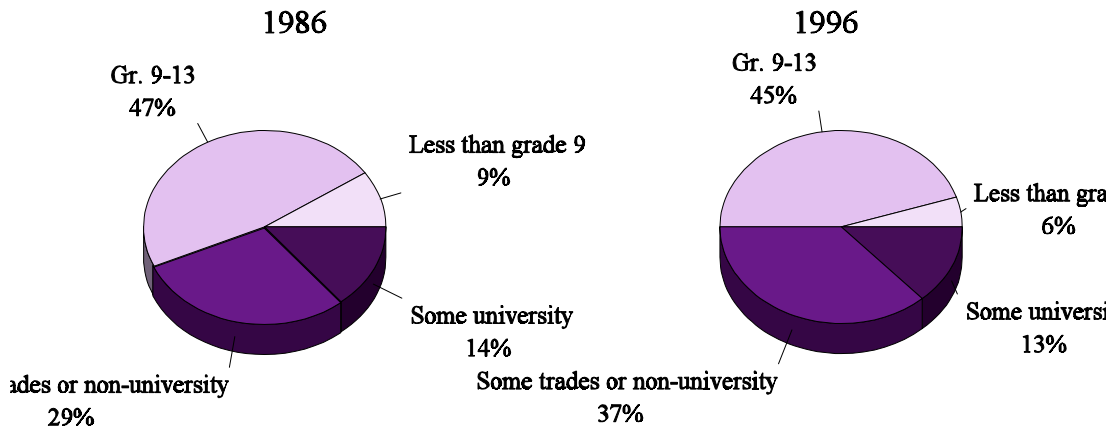
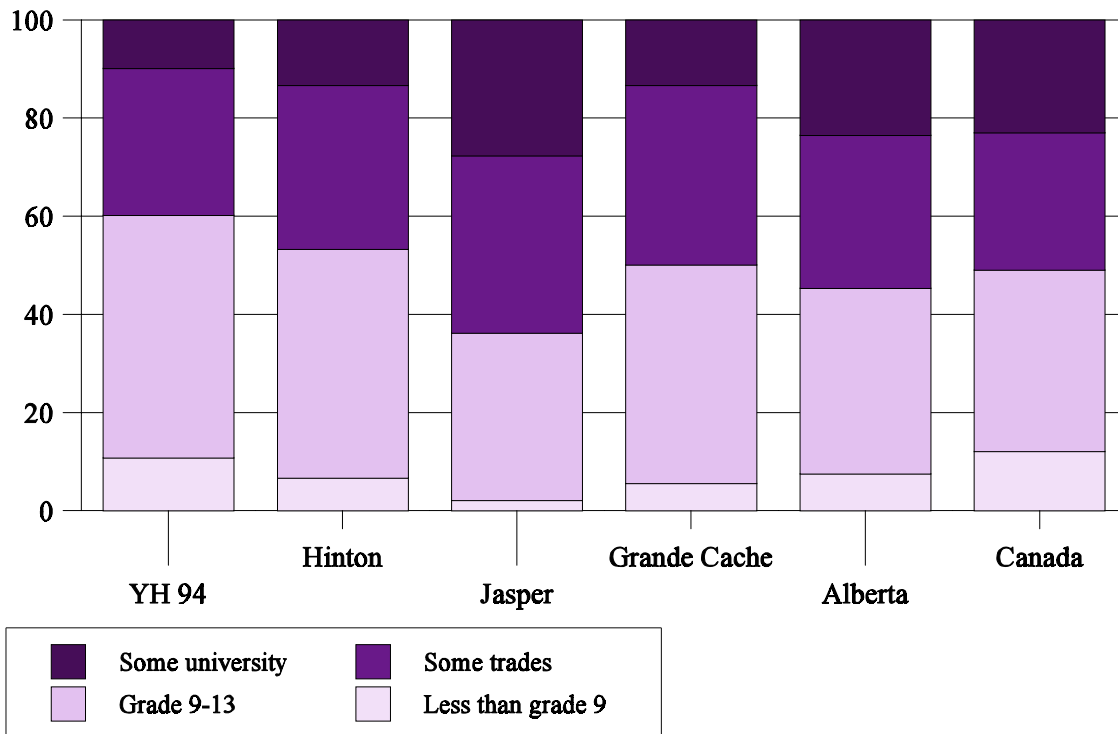


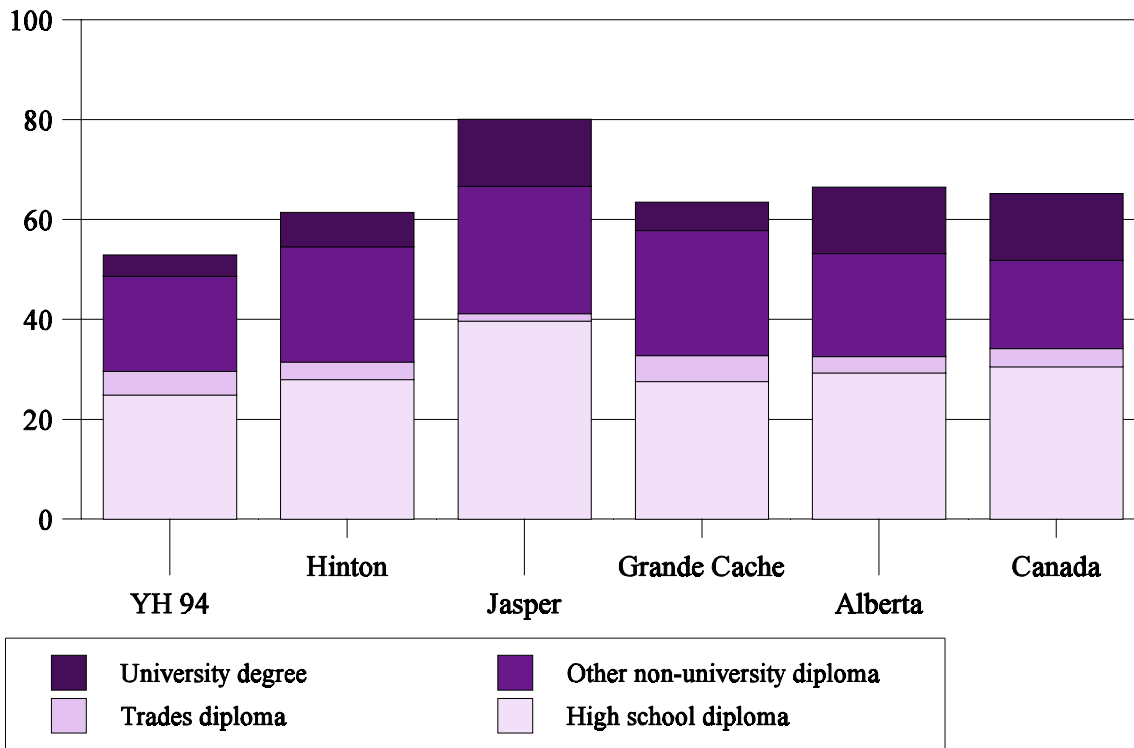

The authors acknowledge that this potentially introduces a slight error if there are individuals enrolled in post-secondary education without a high school diploma.
